VALPARAISO REDEVELOPMENT COMMISSION Regular Meeting Minutes October 17, 2024

The regular meeting of the Valparaiso Redevelopment Commission was called to order at 4:15 p.m. on Thursday, October 17, 2024. Vice President Barbara Domer presided.

Members present were: Trish Sarkisian, Barbara Domer, Bill Durnell and Robert Cotton. Also present were Director of Development George Douglas, City Attorney Patrick Lyp and Engineering Director Max Rehlander and members of the public. Rob Thorgren was not in attendance.

ITEM #1- MINUTES: (00:22)

Mr. Durnell stated Commission members met for the Executive session.

Motion: Mr. Durnell moved to approve the October 17, 2024, Executive meeting Minutes. Ms. Sarkisian seconded. A voice vote was unanimously carried.

Mr. Durnell reported copies of the September 12, 2024, regular meeting minutes were distributed to members for their review prior to the meeting. After reviewing the minutes, all seemed in order.

Motion: Mr. Durnell moved to approve the September 12, 2024, meeting minutes. Ms. Sarkisian seconded. A voice vote was unanimously carried.

ITEM #2 CLAIMS REGISTER AND FINANCIAL REPORT: (1:03)

Mr. Douglas reported that the Commission was sent the October 2024 Claims Registers and September Financial Report prior to the meeting. Mr. Douglas highlighted a few key claims and noteworthy items in the Claims Register and August Financial Report.

Discussion from Commission members ensued. Questions and items of discussion included:

- The MKSK West Street Corridor Study
- The Taft & Vale invoice and project information
- Barnes & Thornburg lobbying fees and activities
- August Mack expenses for Regal Beloit

City staff answered and addressed questions and discussion items.

Motion: Ms. Sarkisian motioned to approve the October Register and September Financial Report. Mr. Cotton seconded the motion. A voice vote was unanimously carried.

ITEM #3 AUTHORIZATION FOR RDC DIRECTOR TO ISSUE AN RFP TO FARM RDC LAND ALONG RT. 49: (11:33)

Mr. Douglas requested authorization to issue an RFP for the previously leased farm property along 49. Mr. Douglas stated there are no current development plans for the site. The RFP aims to maximize the value of the property for the 2025 planting season with coordination needed with the Parks Department regarding protected areas on the property. The Parks Department will work with US Fish and Wildlife to identify the areas that cannot be disturbed as part of their agreement.

Discussion from Commission members ensued. Questions and items of discussion included:

- The original Farm Lease Agreement
- The revenues collected to date
- The number of acres that will be farmed in 2025
- Contract provisions if a development project were to come up during the contract period

City staff answered and addressed questions and discussion items.

Motion: Mr. Cotton motioned to approve the Authorization for RDC Director to Issue an RFP to Farm the Land Along RT. 49. Mr. Durnell seconded the motion. A voice vote was unanimously carried.

ITEM #4 DISCUSSION ON 2025 DRAFT BUDGET: (16:45)

Mr. Douglas presented a draft of the proposed budget for 2025. No vote was needed at the current meeting. The Commission will vote on the budget at the next scheduled meeting on November 14th. The annual spending plan must be uploaded into Indiana's Department of Local Government Finance Gateway system and submitted to the Mayor and City Council by December 1st. Although the RDC has six funds, the budget focuses on the General Fund and TIF Allocation Funds. The TIF Allocation Fund budget represents the consolidation of all of Valparaiso's allocation areas. Tax increment revenues collected by the County are then distributed into this fund at the City. General Fund revenues include tax abatement fees, payment in lieu of taxes (PILOT) payments, ValpoNet lease payments, interest income, and miscellaneous incomes such proceeds from the sell of property.

Highlighting some of the proposed expenditures in the General Fund in 2025, the Director proposed budgeting \$800,000 for sidewalks/pathways, marking a significant increase in investment from the historical budget of \$400,000. Neighborhood grants were proposed to be increased from \$185,000 to \$200,000 based on feedback from the Commission members. A Tree Match of \$5,000 was added back into the budget and will be used to match individual contributions. The Parks Department makes these funds available to purchase and plant trees in or visible from the public right of way. The City Services line item reimburses the City for staffing costs for individuals performing work on behalf of the Redevelopment Commission. This item currently contains a placeholder of \$600,000; but it is expected we will have a more accurate final number from the Clerk-Treasurer's office by next month's meeting, once insurance costs are set. Mr. Douglas forecasted that the General Fund would start the year with a balance of approximately \$5.7 million.

The TIF Allocation Areas Fund are forecasted to receive \$8.8 million in tax revenues in 2025. Interest income is earned from funds deposited with Trust Indiana, which is a local government investment pool that seeks to preserve the principal of the public's funds and prioritize liquidity and return on investment, as well as from funds held locally in bank accounts. Miscellaneous reimbursements in the amount of \$2 million are expected from two projects -- the RDA will reimburse the RDC in the amount of \$1.3 million for the Journeyman/TOD project and a READI 1.0 Grant of \$700,000 for the Streetscape Project around the Lincoln Highway Garage. Due to uncertainty regarding the timing of receiving reimbursements, these reimbursements were also shown in the 2024 budget. Any amounts not received this year, will carry over to the 2025 budget.

On the expenditures side, Debt Service obligations totaling \$5.6 million are included for 2025. This includes final payments on two issues, the 2016B Bond and the 2019 Bond. When these

bonds mature, approximately \$993,000 will be released to from the restricted Debt Reserve Fund to the unencumbered cash balance in the TIF Allocation Areas Fund.

The Industrial Infrastructure category includes \$5.2 million for acquisition and redevelopment of distressed industrial properties such as Regal Beloit.

The Grant Match item covers an estimated \$2.8 million for the local match on projects involving INDOT or Federal grants through NIRPC.

Recurring Expenses item includes a total of \$3.7 million for various local programs as described below. Historically the RDC budgeted School Challenge Grants at \$600,000. However, it is recommended to increase it to \$700,000 in 2025 to include the Porter County Career Center (PCCC) for their programming and projects. Public Safety was increased to \$500,000. These funds were historically used for police vehicle replacement and equipment.

The Economic Development Initiative line item is being moved from the General Fund to the TIF Funds because these expenses are eligible expenses within allocation areas. The amount budgeted remains the same. The Building Improvements and Façade budget will be increased slightly to reflect inflationary increases. Façade Grants are administered through the Planning Department and the Board of Works, and the Commission is a contributor of funds toward these initiatives. Environmental Protection is being increased from \$125,000 to \$300,000 in anticipation of potential needs for the Regal Beloit project.

Utility Improvements was increased to \$1 million. Mr. Douglas is working with City Utilities ("VCU") and developers on two specific projects, one of which is a water main extension in the Montdale Industrial Park area going out to 325 East and another for the installation of a public lift station at Marsh St and Hwy 30 with a force main going back to Horseprairie lift station. The proposed public lift station will serve anticipated future development and will benefit the surrounding area. The total for these two projects is approximately \$2 million but the Redevelopment Commission will split the cost of these utility infrastructure projects with VCU.

Professional Studies is a new budget item of \$450,000 to be used for an economic development plan for Park 30 East and the surrounding area. The City annexed several parcels in the southeast area and there are more parcels being considered. It would be beneficial to the Commission and City to plan and coordinate with the County for the future development of this area. Professional Services includes \$310,000 to cover outside contracts for services performed in support of the Commission and various projects.

Downtown Housing & Parking includes \$1.2 million to cover public infrastructure, which could include alleyways and sidewalks in the downtown area; county parking garage use; miscellaneous expenses for the parking garage and the remainder of the streetscape improvements. A new budget category for Workforce Housing Initiatives totaling \$750,000 was added to provide support for housing initiatives/grants, property acquisition, and infrastructure.

Bus Purchase/Operations includes \$580,000 in funds for a local match for the purchase of a replacement bus as well as funds to support Chicago Dash operations.

Eastside Projects include \$450,000 in funds to complete the design for the extension of Memorial Parkway and right of way acquisition.

Discussion from Commission members ensued throughout budget presentation. Questions and items of discussion included:

- Whether the \$800,000 budgeted for the sidewalks and pathways is separate from the budgeted amount for the Grants Match.
- Whether all or part of the farm property is in the TIF district.
- How often interest is received from Trust Indiana.
- The inclusion of the Porter County Career Center in the School Challenge Grants and if SELF School could also be included.
- Are costs for transportation allowed in the Challenge Grants parameters.
- What would be a reimbursable expense paid out of the Economic Development Funds.
- Are the Façade Grants only reimbursed by the Redevelopment Commission if they are in a TIF District.
- Are the utility improvements for South Campbell and Horseprairie included in the \$1 million grant for the project.
- Will the pay as you go increase to utilities pay for any of the utility projects, we are budgeting.
- When we would use bonds for projects/infrastructure instead of TIF funds.
- What is the economic impact of the Northern Indiana Law Enforcement Academy (NILEA) and Pottinger.
- What impact, if any, will the improvement work have on West St residents.
- Whether specific projects are in place for the money budgeted in Workforce Housing Initiatives.
- Could money be allocated out of Workforce Housing Initiatives for downpayment assistance for first responders and possibly teachers and how would that be accomplished.
- Is there a breakdown of the total cost of each of the grant projects.

City staff answered and addressed questions and discussion items.

ITEM #5 OTHER BUSINESS: (107:32)

Mr. Douglas requested authorization for the president or vice president to sign the proposed Purchase Agreement for Regal Beloit. The agreement will be circulated to the Redevelopment Commission members.

Motion: Mr. Durnell motioned to authorize the president or vice president to sign the proposed Purchase Agreement for Regal Beloit. Ms. Sarkisian seconded the motion. A voice vote was unanimously carried.

Discussion from Commission members ensued. Questions and items of discussion included:

- When the agreement will be circulated.
- Is the Commission comfortable with the next level of remediation for the project.

City staff answered and addressed questions and discussion items.

ITEM #8 ADJOURNMENT: (112:19)

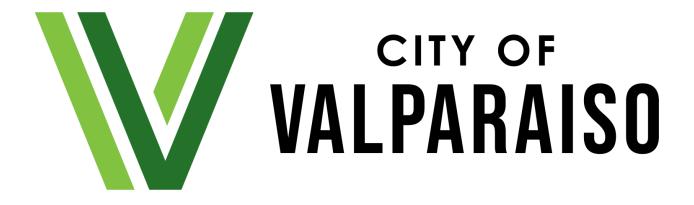

Dear Potential Partners,

The City of Valparaiso strategically installed fiber optic infrastructure all throughout its municipal boundaries. This investment has allowed for increased efficiency and effectiveness in networking municipal facilities and operations.

In addition, this significant investment in fiber optic infrastructure and a spare conduit is providing Valparaiso Redevelopment Commission (VRDC) with an opportunity to leverage this public asset in order to provide residents and local businesses with greater access to high-speed broadband internet technology. The outcome envisioned is that greater access to broadband internet technology will create an economic environment where Valparaiso residents and businesses more choices to affordable, high-speed internet for employment, education, consumerism, and telemedicine needs, which are required to successfully function and compete in today's society.

Therefore, the VRDC is issuing a Request for Information ("RFI") for the purpose of determining whether the VRDC should enter into a relationship with a third-party to capitalize on Valparaiso's built out dark fiber network.

The general idea is for Valparaiso to leverage its assets by providing its fiber optics to a third-party provider so the third-party provider can expand its coverage area and leverage its telecommunications investment to residents and businesses. The types of entities that Valparaiso believes would be successful participants in this project would include: Internet Service Providers ("ISPs"), competitive local exchange carriers ("CLECs"), local exchange carriers ("LECs"), and data centers.

I. BACKGROUND & PURPOSE

The City of Valparaiso (the "City" or "Valparaiso") possesses fiber throughout the Valparaiso landscape (shown on **Exhibit A**) ("ValpoNet") and owns two conduits – one empty 2" conduit and the other conduit houses two hundred and eighty-eight (288) fibers. Of the two-hundred and eighty-eight (288) fibers, less than thirty-six (36) fibers are being used by current ValpoNet customers. As such, a significant number of these fibers and an empty conduit may be available to a third-party provider(s). The City desires to make these fiber facilities available to third parties, if a suitable arrangement is made. Valparaiso is issuing this Request for Information ("RFI") for the purpose of determining whether the City should enter into a relationship with a third-party.

There are three current ValpoNet customers. Information related to each customer including contract term and expiration are available in **Exhibit B**, incorporated by reference and attached hereto.

The City seeks ideas and interest from private entities regarding bringing higher speed broadband to current homes and businesses and will explore all opportunities to monetize the City's network including, but not limited to the following: joint venture, leasing dark fiber, selling fiber, and selling empty conduit. To that end, the City issues this RFI to determine the interest of private entities to collaborate with the City and maximize ValpoNet to expand broadband infrastructure to other parts of Valparaiso.

In responses to this RFI, the City seeks to learn how the respondent's approach will further the City's goals of ensuring that residents, businesses, and visitors to our community have access to market-leading broadband services. The City also seeks input from potential partners regarding the terms and conditions under which they would participate in such a project. To that end, the City is interested in all possibilities such as: joint venture with the redevelopment commission, leasing dark fiber, selling fiber, and selling empty conduit.

We are prepared to consider a variety of business models that may share technological and operational responsibilities and financial risk between the partners and the City in innovative ways. We encourage respondents to share their expertise, which may be used to shape the direction and form of this potential initiative. Respondents may work together to respond to this RFI. The City is open to creative solutions that will maximize private investment, as well as state and federal broadband funding, while providing reliable and high-quality services to meet its citizens' needs.

We welcome the responses of all prospective partners, including traditional ISPs, CLECs, LECs, as well as nonprofit organizations, public cooperatives, and entities that are interested in acting as a partner in offering service under innovative business models. Nontraditional providers may respond as part of a partnership with an ISP or may provide separate responses outlining their approaches.

The City will review responses based on the respondents' experience, how well the responses address the City's objectives, how the proposed business model balances and shares risks and rewards, and other factors. The City may provide more detailed information on available assets to one or more respondents and asks those respondents to refine their responses. Following the evaluation of responses, the City may issue a request for more detail relating to the City-initiated project, cancel or delay plans to monetize ValpoNet, or choose another direction that is deemed in the City's best interest. Responding to the RFI is not a guarantee of a contract award. Further, there is no guarantee an RFP will be developed as a result of this RFI. The City reserves the right to withdraw the RFI or any subsequent RFP, or to decline to award a contract.

Valparaiso's expectation is that it will review responses to this RFI, and subsequently interview the best respondents. The end goal envisioned is to establish a contractual relationship with a third-party provider(s), so that the third-party provider(s) will provide services to Valparaiso residents and businesses, and, in some manner, share that revenue with the City.

II. RFI Questionnaire

Please provide answers to the following questions below. The questions below are not all-inclusive, and we encourage respondents to provide other information it deems relevant to the purpose and intent of this RFI.

A. Providing Enhanced Services to Valparaiso Businesses

One of the primary reasons for the City to seek third-party management of ValpoNet is to allow businesses the ability to access the high-quality services available through ValpoNet. These potential subscribers may not have the ability or the budget to own their own fiber or manage the optical equipment required.

- 1) How would you manage and distribute broadband services throughout ValpoNet?
- 2) What increments of broadband could be sold?
- 3) What additional provider services will these businesses have access to? Disaster recovery, storage, replication, back-up, voice services, etc.?
- 4) What managed or hosted services are available through your operations?
- 5) What "last mile" advantages are available?

B. Providing Carrier Access

- 1) Can you manage the fiber throughout the entire Valparaiso network that would eliminate or postpone Valparaiso's need to build a POP to allow carriers access to ValpoNet?
- 2) How would other carriers access the Valparaiso fiber through your network/facilities?
- 3) How would "Last Mile" connectivity be configured?

- 4) What significant networks does your network/facilities connect to or serve?
- 5) Are there vertical markets or industries that could more easily be accessed by connecting through your network/facilities?

C. Third Party Management Fees, Costs, Revenue Generation

The possibility of Valparaiso generating revenue while enabling third parties to offer enhanced services, at cost effective rates, to businesses is being seriously considered.

- 1) What components will be included in any upfront cost to Valparaiso to set up the services before the first customer is sold and are the costs scalable? Please consider installation, equipment, connections to primary data center, and others.
- 2) What monthly cost components will Valparaiso be responsible for prior to the first customer? As customers are added?
- 3) From what types of monthly service charges to businesses and from what types of fees charged to carriers would Valparaiso be able to generate revenue?
- 4) What would you anticipate paying Valparaiso for access to the ValpoNet?

D. Working with the City

The City intends to work with a third-party provider to:

- Identify existing businesses' telecommunications needs and propose solutions.
- 2) Identify businesses that are considering moving to Valparaiso and determine the telecommunication needs and opportunities of the business.
- 3) Explore opportunities to provide service to the Valparaiso School District.

III. RFI PROCEDURE
