

City of Valparaiso Opioid Funding Application

Background: From 2022 through 2023, the State of Indiana has acquired and is disbursing funds to fight this epidemic. Disbursements are currently scheduled to be received by units through 2038. Over the years, Valparaiso expects to receive approximately \$1,466,263.39. The City of Valparaiso is seeking to fight this epidemic by providing funds to organizations working to support people in treatment and recovery. The funds are appropriated through an Abatement Share (Restricted) and an Unrestricted Share.

Abatement Fund (Restricted):

The Abatement Fund (Restricted) balance as of April 1, 2025, is \$256,031.89. Additional anticipated revenue in this fund this year is \$85,323.53 for a total estimated 2025 funding of \$341,355.42.

Unrestricted Fund:

The Unrestricted Fund balance as of April 1, 2025, is \$185,183.10. Additional anticipated revenue in this fund this year is \$36,567.22 for a total estimated 2025 funding of \$221,750.32

Note: Applications must go through a review process. Opioid funding is limited, and some applications may not be approved. Only proposals directly related to addressing the opioid epidemic will be considered for funding.

Step 1: Determine Eligibility	Step 1. Determine eligibility for funding proposal consideration. In order to qualify for funding, the organization must fall into one of the following two categories: 1) The organization must be a nonprofit entity registered as a 501C3 or governmental agency working to combat substance use disorder. ▪ Examples of Abatement Fund expenses for reimbursement: ○ Prevention Programs ○ Treatment for Opioid use disorder ○ Provide social workers to work with and support local agencies dealing with substance abuse disorders. ▪ Examples of Unrestricted Fund expenses for reimbursement: ○ Repairs to building and facilities ○ Pay utility bills ○ Purchase a vehicle ○ Purchase equipment
