## VALPARAISO BOARD OF ZONING APPEALS Regular Meeting Minutes May 19, 2021

The regular meeting of the Valparaiso Board of Zoning Appeals was held at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 19, 2021 at Valparaiso City Hall, 166 Lincolnway, Valparaiso, Indiana. Remote access was available via livestream on the Valparaiso City Website. Mike Micka presided.

Members present were Paul Reed, Kyle Yelton, Byron Martin, and Mike Micka. Also present were Beth Shrader, Carley Lemmon, Attorney Patrick Lyp, and petitioners. Diane Worstell arrived after roll call.

### **MINUTES:**

Paul Reed made a motion to approve the April 21, 2021 minutes as presented. Kyle Yelton seconded the motion. A voice vote was taken and unanimously carried 4-0.

### **OLD BUSINESS:**

None.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

<u>VAR21-006</u> – A petition filed by Beth Wrobel. The property is located at 2401 Valley Dr in the Business Park (BP) Zoning District. The petitioner requests the following variance(s):

• Article 2, Section 2.403 (F)(3) – To vary the maximum accessory structure height to allow for an accessory structure height of 19' 8 3/4".

Ms. Beth Wrobel presented. HealthLinc would like to build an accessory structure to house their mobile van as well as accommodate extra need in giving vaccinations. The mobile unit's height is 14.5 feet requiring a 16-foot overhead door. Because of this the structure is up to 19 feet 8 3/4".

<u>Public Hearing:</u> Beth Shrader asked if any of the public would like to speak in favor of or in opposition of this petition. Ms. Shrader also asked that the public address their questions to the Board Members while at the same time the petitioner will take notes and respond at one time. No one spoke; therefore, the public hearing was closed, and questions/comments were heard from the Members.

- O: What is the exact location of the building?
- A: Centered at the north of the property. A site design was provided in the Member's packets.
- Q: There are a number of trailer units on the property now. What is their purpose?
- A: Currently those are for help with the Covid vaccines and will be removed once that is no longer needed.
- Q: Are there landscaping requirements that go with this?
- A: Plan were submitted with landscaping and will create a buffer to the north. No variances were requested for landscaping. There is no landscape buffer requirement to the west because the adjacent parcel is also Business Park Zoning.
- Q: Is this a separate lot?
- A: No. It has all been joined with HealthLinc's existing lot.

Staff advised a thorough review of the plan was made and height is the only variance needed.

<u>Motion:</u> Paul Reed made a motion to approve VAR21-006 o vary the maximum accessory structure height to allow for an accessory structure height of 19' 8 3/4" as presented and based on the proposed findings of fact. Kyle Yelton seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken and unanimously carried 5-0.

<u>VAR21-007</u> – A petition filed by Stephanie Edwards. The property is located at 3400 Venice Dr in the Suburban Residential (SR) Zoning District. The petitioner requests the following variance(s):

• Article 3, Section 3.501(B), Table 3.501 – To vary the maximum lot coverage to allow for a maximum lot coverage of 44.34%.

Ms. Stephanie Edwards presented. We would like to install an inground pool at our home. We were approved through our homeowner's association. It will be a 16x32-foot pool with a concrete apron surrounding it.

<u>Public Hearing:</u> Beth Shrader asked if any of the public would like to speak in favor of or in opposition of this petition. Ms. Shrader also asked that the public address their questions to the Board Members while at the same time the petitioner will take notes and respond at one time. No one spoke; therefore, the public hearing was closed, and questions/comments were heard from the Members.

- Q: Will the entire yard be fenced?
- A: Yes. We will also have an auto cover.

<u>Motion:</u> Paul Reed made a motion to approve VAR21-007 o vary the maximum lot coverage to allow for a maximum lot coverage of 44.34% as presented and based on proposed findings of fact. Kyle Yelton seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken and unanimously carried 5-0.

<u>VAR21-008</u> – A petition filed by Jason Lynn c/o Todd A. Leeth, 103 Lincolnway, Valparaiso, IN 46383. The property is located at 306 Glendale Blvd in the General Residential (GR) Zoning District. The petitioner requests the following variance(s):

• Article 2, Section 2.303(D)(2) – To vary the maximum accessory building footprint to allow for an accessory building footprint of 1,040.40 Sq. Ft.

Attorney Katie Kopf presented. Mr. Jason Lynn was also present. There is an existing home on the property that is .42 acres in size. The petitioner purchased the property and has been renovating the home. The owner would like a variance to allow for an 1,040 square-foot accessory building to allow for a garage and carport.

<u>Public Hearing:</u> Beth Shrader asked if any of the public would like to speak in favor of or in opposition of this petition. Ms. Shrader also asked that the public address their questions to the Board Members while at the same time the petitioner will take notes and respond at one time.

Via webinar comments – <u>Joe Arredondo</u> – why is a variance being requested after the structure has already been built, and is there a fine for doing so?

### Attorney Kopf's rebuttal:

When Mr. Lynn started his renovations, he visited the building department for proper permits and his understanding was that a variance was not needed. It has since been discovered that a variance is necessary.

Ms. Shrader advised written correspondence was received Mary Brown, 305 Stanley Street, Valparaiso stating the home has been beautifully renovated.

The public hearing was closed, and questions/comments were heard from the Members.

- C: Attorney Lyp noted that there is a difference of opinion between the petitioner and the Building Department regarding the initial contact with Mr. Lynn.
- C: Ms. Shrader advised there is no current fee schedule for a situation such as this.
- Q: Is this home owner-occupied?
- A: No.
- Q: Were building permits received?
- A: No, the understanding was that if the petitioner was replacing an existing material then a building permit was not necessary. The garage was there originally so we thought replacing it was permitted.
- Q: Is on street parking permitted at this location on Glendale Blvd?
- A: Not directly in front of this property.

<u>Motion:</u> Diane Worstell made a motion to approve VAR21-008 to vary the maximum accessory building footprint to allow for an accessory building footprint of 1,040.40 square feet as presented and based on the proposed findings of fact. Kyle Yelton seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken and unanimously carried 5-0.

<u>VAR21-009</u> – A petition filed by Matthew Stechly. The property is located at 210 Carter Ct in the Suburban Residential (SR) Zoning District. The petitioner requests the following variance(s):

Article 2, Section 2.303(D)(6) – To vary the requirement for the accessory structure to
match materials of the principal structure to allow for an accessory structure with metal
siding.

Mr. Matthew Stechly presented. Carter Court is a private drive with four to five homes existing on it. He has lived at this location for 10 years and is now financial able to construct an accessory structure to be his hobby shop. 30x30 accessory building. Due to cost, he needs to have a metal structure. Color will match the home. There are other accessory structures in his immediate area, so his request is not unique to this street.

<u>Public Hearing:</u> Beth Shrader asked if any of the public would like to speak in favor of or in opposition of this petition. Ms. Shrader also asked that the public address their questions to the Board Members while at the same time the petitioner will take notes and respond at one time

Beth Shrader noted the following written correspondences:

The public hearing was closed, and questions/comments were heard from the Members.

- O: What type of roof will the structure have?
- A: Metal.
- Q: Will there be a drive to the structure?
- A: Currently it is grass, but we are considering other hardscape options for the future.

<u>Motion:</u> Paul Reed made a motion to approve VAR21-009 to vary the requirement for the accessory structure to match materials of the principal structure to allow for an accessory structure with metal siding as presented and based on the proposed findings of fact. Kyle Yelton seconded the motion. A roll call vote was taken and unanimously carried 5-0.

### STAFF ITEMS:

<u>Fines</u> - Attorney Lyp advised that the current City policy is that as long as a property owner acknowledges they are in default and they are working to correct the issue then there is no fine.

**Errors** - Attorney Lyp commented occasionally a petitioner will suggest that the City made an error. In those situations, we will want to make sure we get the input from the department that is suggested of making the error.

# DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED PROJECT: (OR EXHIBIT NO. \_\_\_\_\_)

LEGAL DESCRIPTION OF SUBJECT PROPERTY: (OR EXHIBIT NO.

560 Bond Avenue is requesting a Special Use Permit to provide conforming use and conforming structure. This Special Use Permit will allow us to continue using the building and property in the same manner and under the same zoning classification as has historically been done for the last approximately 70 years under UDO Division 13.400. We are not making any changes to the use or structure, we are merely asking for a finding of Special Use Conformity due to the recently changed zoning class and for Structure Conformity from historical land use ordinance changes over the years.

Our property serves as a type of "business incubator" facility for smaller light industrial users such as an organic wine wholesaler, a custom cabinetry builder, a fire-stop equipment fabricator, a custom auto detailer, and other light industry uses. Due to our attractive, well-appointed facility, our property enjoys 100% occupancy for the last 10 years and a waiting list for new tenants. We have an excellent record with our neighbors and we operate in a responsible, neighborhood-friendly manner.

Recently, on May 10, 2021, our property was rezoned from Light Industrial (INL) to Commercial Neighborhood (CN) as a part of the general rezoning of central city industrial sites to lower impact zoning classes. Our property still complies, grandfathered as a legal non-conforming use of INL. However, because that grandfathering could be jeopardized if there was an interruption of use or significant damage to the building, we have been working with Ms. Shrader for a Special Use Permit with restrictions both for the building use and the structure (which met requirements in the 1940s when it was built).

Our tenants have voiced concerns that our property's legal non-conforming use status could jeopardize their ability to obtain loans. As a result, legal non-conforming use status would harm our ability to keep the building rented

# Special Exception/Special Use Petitioner's Proposed Findings of Fact

### Petitioner Submits that:

A. The special use will not materially detract from the character of the immediate area or negatively affect the anticipated development or redevelopment trajectory because:

The use of the property as a small industrial business incubator will not change and the property enjoys a very good relationship with its neighbors. At the recent Plan Commission meeting, one neighbor described the property as "a gem." The property has been owned and operated by Janet Froberg-McNair and her family for the last 70 years. The size and type of the property also limits negative impacts. Further, the property owner and the Valparaiso Director of Planning, Ms. Shader, have worked out a set of conditions (in D. below) for the Special Use Permit which will facilitate continued harmony with the neighborhood.

This Special Use Permit is supported by the Valparaiso Planning Department.

B. There is no practicable alternative location where the use is permitted as-of-right within one-quarter mile of the parcel proposed for development, or, if such a location exists, the proposed location is more favorable in terms of providing a needed community service to a population that has limited mobility because:

The 560 Bond property is a unique building which rents to various small businesses such as an organic wine wholesaler, a wine wholesaler, residential renovator/rehabber, Dave Smith/Smith Ready Mix, specialty woodworking, fire protection fabricator, auto detailing business and vintage car restorer. We are aware of no other similar use within one-quarter mile. Out tenants have said they could find no alternative locations with the features and support we offer. This Special Use Permit under Dvision 13.400 of the UDO, Mitigation of Nonconformities, gives this important property and its tenants the assurance of continuity of use while enabling Valparaiso to update it's zoning map effective May 10, 2021. This Special Use Permit under Division 13.400 would be recorded with the County Recorder and an annotation would be made on the Official Zoning Map as provided in Section 13.404.

C. The approval of the special use will not create a critical mass of similar special uses that is likely to tend to discourage permitted uses by making the vicinity less desirable for them because:

This property is a unique, impeccably well-maintained small business hub with very low traffic and noise impacts. There are no similar uses to our knowledge in the area. We have run the building in a similar manner for nearly 70 years and have great relationships with our neighbors.

The building meets the criteria for approval stated in UDO Section 13.403(B) because: 1. tenants of the building hire many neighborhood residents, particularly for the custom auto detailing work; 2. Management has an excellent track record of no nuisances by the installation of noise/sound-blocking fencing, prohibiting overnight parking, prohibiting outside materials storage and keeping a very clean facility; 3. We enjoy a record clear of complaints because we work with our neighbors to prevent nuisances; and 4. Our facility is immaculately maintained (see attached photos). Classification as a nonconformity creates a disincentive to maintenance because tenancy rates will decline and value of the building will be diminished.

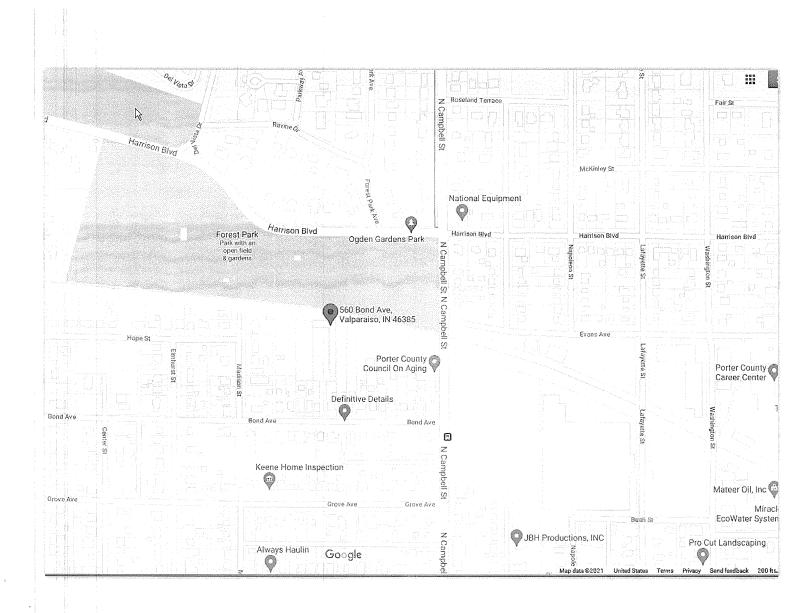
D. The special use is conducted in a manner that is not materially more disruptive to adjacent properties than other permitted uses in the district unless the special use is temporary and the duration of the use is limited to minimize the impact because:

(Include any proposed conditions of approval to ensure that this requirement is satisfied.)

- · Uses permitted in Light Industrial (INL) zoning district would be continued, supported and permitted per Table 2.201A of the UDO, except the following as they are defined in the current UDO: Kennel; Protective Care; Agriculture Support and Other Rural Services; Heavy Retail; Light Automobile Service; Car wash (except auto detailing, which shall be permitted); Vehicle Sales, Rental, and Service; Adult Uses; Recycling/Salvage; College/University; Parking (stand alone lot) and Transit Facilities; Any use with outdoor storage.
- Limited and Special Use Standards from Division 2.500 of the UDO apply.

 Emitted and special ose standards from Division 2.300 of the ODO apply.
 No single user will take up more than 4,000 sq. ft. interior space of the building.
 The Special Use permit is also be supported by the Planning Department to approve the structure on the property in its current configuration as a conforming structure with respect to the standards for CN zone. As agreed with the Department, conformity will allow repairs and alterations to extend the life of the structure, but not to expand the footprint of the structure beyond the current building coverage (approximately 11,700 SF). As also agreed, conformity will relieve the structure from the restrictions of Sec. 13.307, except that if portions of the structure that are outside the property lines are destroyed, they may only be rebuilt within the property lines.

The petitioner carries the burden of proving to the Board of Zoning Appeals the existence of each element listed above.

#### 2263 Land Control History

2263 Land Control History as to why my property follows a different GR than CITY's current GR zoning code (in this case I believe the only exception is my property width) – 2021.05.14.

Originally the community was developed by Naples Development LLC. The property was under Porter County control – which had different requirements for Sewer, Curb Dip, Lot Width, Etc. Naples had the proper bond maintained with the county for post development pavement of the community. Most of the community was zoned for Duplex under the Porter County General Residence Code.

Tim Henderlong's Company purchased ~100-200 lots from Naples and began developing Duplexes. During this time the community was brought into the Valparaiso City annex --- however Valpo accepted the development's existing General Residence Code and other Code as is (different sewer standards, no dips on the sidewalks, different property widths, etc). Tim filed for some of the duplex property zones to be split into Single Family homes under the grandfathered Porter County Codes while retaining others as duplex lots. As an aside, the post-development bond was not moved from the county to the city so this expired.

Charlie Griener's Company then purchased 70-80 lots from Tim, and he began to file for (zoning, engineering, etc) many of the duplex property zones to be split into Single Family lots under the current Valpo City GR code. A few of the properties would not easily split into the new code so these he left as Duplex lots following the grandfathered in GR originally outlined by Naples. At this time Valpo discovered the bond for the paving had expired as it was never moved to the City from the County, and Valpo had to push Naples with the promise of leans on their remaining 30 lots for Naples to purchase a fresh bond for the final paving.
