

2020 Census Impacts Funding for the Future

The Census is coming and it's important for everyone to count. Taken every ten years, the Census is an official head count of all residents. The results help determine how the federal government distributes more than \$675 billion in government funding, as well as representation in Washington, D.C.

"By making sure you're counted, you help ensure that our community continues to compete well for funding opportunities, including dollars for public safety, schools, senior services and more," said Mayor Matt Murphy.

Census forms will be mailed to homes by the end of March. You can respond online, by mail or by phone. The form takes only minutes to complete, the results are completely confidential and can only be used to produce statistics. For more information, visit 2020Census.gov.
